1. Consider Resolution No. 2017-04 – Adopting the Budgets for the Fiscal Year Ending September 20, 2018, for the District; Providing Authority for the District Manager to Expend Funds on Behalf of the District

Resolution No. 2017-04 was presented, entitled:

RESOLUTION NO. 2017-04

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE ST. LUCIE WEST SERVICES DISTRICT ADOPTING THE BUDGETS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2018 FOR THE DISTRICT; PROVIDING AUTHORITY FOR THE DISTRICT MANAGER TO EXPEND FUNDS ON BEHALF OF THE DISTRICT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Pickle gave a budget overview and noted the changes that had been made since the last meeting. He noted that included in the budget was the creation of new positions for succession planning, which would eventually have to go through the Public Hearing process, which he foresaw as being held in December. Vice Chairman Ney asked if the positions could be filled in-house to which Mr. Pickle responded that they would try. He noted that one position was considered "management" and would require Board approval.

Mr. Pickle noted that the maintenance special assessment was being lowered from \$111 to \$106 and that the information had already been sent to the County last week.

There was no further discussion regarding this item.

DM 4 – Public Resource Management Group 2018 Water, Wastewater and Irrigation System Revenue Sufficiency Update

Ryan Smith of PRMG (Public Resources Management Group, Inc.) then made his presentation on the 2018 Water, Wastewater and Irrigation System Revenue Sufficiency Update. He indicated conservative growth estimates and noted that they were not suggesting any rate increases until 2021.

A brief Q&A period took place after which the Board thanked Mr. Smith for his presentation.

F. Public Hearing 2

1. Consider Resolution No. 2017-05 – Levying a Non-Ad Valorem Assessment for Water Management Bonds, Operations and Maintenance Costs, and the Series 2010 Capital Improvement Revenue Bonds (Cascades Project) within the St. Lucie West Services District for the Period October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018

Resolution No. 2017-05 was presented, entitled:

RESOLUTION 2017-05

LEVYING A NON AD VALOREM ASSESSMENT FOR WATER MANAGEMENT BONDS, OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE COSTS, AND THE SERIES 2010 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT REVENUE BONDS (CASCADES PROJECT) WITHIN THE ST. LUCIE WEST SERVICES DISTRICT FOR THE PERIOD OCTOBER 1, 2017, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2018

Mr. Pickle presented the resolution and reminded the Board that the maintenance special assessment had been lowered to \$106 from the \$111 indicated in the Resolution.

Vice Chairman Ney indicated that he was happy that the assessment was going back down even though the District is planning additional infrastructure.

There was no discussion on this item.

G. Public Comment

There was no public comment at this time.

H. District AttorneyDA 1 – Status Report/Updates

Mr. Pickle was not aware of any updates from Mr. Harrell.

I. District Engineer DE 1 – Status Report/Updates

Mr. Pickle noted that Lake Harvey was getting larger due to the recent rains.

Mr. Pickle noted that the gates worked great during the storm where the area received 9 ½ inches of rain within 24 hours. He indicated that staff needs to look at some projections after the storm to possible tweak the system. He stated that there was no water in the streets because of the lowered lake elevations prior to the storm. He did state, however, that some grates needed to be cleared, which caused some localized flooding, but that the grates were clogged because of the blowing debris. A brief discussion ensued regarding the City's ability to collect debris from inside HOAs and the fact that new agreements need to be put into place. The District's grate design was also discussed to which Mr. Pickle replied that he was going to look at the grates that caused the problems.

J. District Manager Action Items

DM 1 – Consider Approval of Supplement to the SunGard Public Sector LLC (Superion LLC) Application Service Provider Agreement # 141392-4

Mr. Pickle presented the item indicating that this was a utility billing software update and was necessary in order to obtain reports. Mr. Pickle advised that the new monthly charges would be \$3,228.64, which included the increased monthly access fee of \$423.75 for the new reporting software.

There was no discussion regarding this item.

DM 2 – Consider Approval of the District's Holiday Schedule for the 2018 Calendar Year

Mr. Pickle presented the proposed Holiday Schedule for 2018. Chairman D'Amico noted that Memorial Day was Monday, May 28, 2018, not May 25th as indicated. Mr. Pickle noted that he would bring a revised Holiday Schedule to tomorrow's Board Meeting.

There was no further discussion regarding this item.

DM 3 - Consider Approval for the Replacement of Two Sodium Hypochlorite Tanks for the Wastewater Treatment Plant

Mr. Pickle presented the item indicating that this was for the replacement of two sodium hypochlorite tanks at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. He noted that one of the tanks had recently failed and that the life expectancy for them is 8 to 10 years. He noted that the tanks had been put into service in July, 2008. Mr. Pickle advised that they had received 2 proposals, as follows:

- 1.) Odyssey Manufacturing Company of Tampa, Florida bid includes installation and materials for \$35,500.00;
- 2.) CEJCO of Lawrenceville, Georgia bid only includes materials for \$33,331.16

Discussion ensued regarding the warranty. Mr. Pickle also noted that the funds would be obtained from the Emergency Renewal & Replacement because it was not a budgeted item.

Mr. Pickle then suggested reevaluating limits on District Manager spending. Supervisor Doughney noted that the District could mimic State law because it is updated regularly.

There was no further discussion regarding this item.

DM 5 – Consider Approval and Ratification of Contract with the Florida Department of Corrections Contract # W1109

Mr. Pickle presented the item, indicating that the contract had already been signed and he was seeking ratification.

Vice Chairman Ney noted that if Mr. Pickle's spending limit was higher, this item would not need to come before the Board.

There was no discussion on this contract.

DM 6 – Consider Resolution No. 2017-06 – Establishing the Fiscal Year 2018 Workshop and Regular Meeting Schedule and Location

Mr. Pickle presented Resolution No. 2017-06, entitled:

DM 7A – Consider Approval for the Purchase of a New Jet/Vac Truck for the Underground Utilities Division/Stormwater Division

Mr. Pickle presented the item, indicating that staff had received the following 2 proposals:

- 1.) Pat's Pump + Blower of Orlando, Florida in the amount of \$357,240.00; and
- 2.) Southern Sewer Equipment Sales of Fort Pierce, Florida in the amount of \$382,879.00

Mr. Pickle indicated that staff was recommending Pat's Pump + Blower and noted that it would be ordered in the last quarter of the current fiscal year, but would be delivered approximately 120 days from the order date.

Secretary Smith asked about the old one. Mr. Pickle indicated it would be sold on govdeals.com.

There was no further discussion on this item.

DM 7B – Consider Approval of Change Order #2 to J.W. Cheatham for the 2016 Stormwater Enhancement Project – Lake Harvey

Mr. Pickle presented the item, indicating that this Change Order #2 was due to a request from the City of Port St. Lucie to leave the land bridge across the wetland so that it could be used to develop a walking trail. It will leave a 20-foot berm for a sidewalk and a pavilion and the City would provide the pipe in order for water to flow under the walking bridge.

There was no discussion regarding this matter.

DM 8 – Other Items/Updates

Mr. Pickle indicated he had received positive emails from residents after Hurricane Irma.

Mr. Pickle advised that long-term employee, Roger Lane, was retiring on September 30, 2017.

H. District AttorneyDA 1 – Status Report/Updates

Mr. Harrell indicated he had done some research on increasing the District Manager's spending limits. Mr. Harrell also suggested changing other District policies that reference amounts. Discussion ensued regarding the different ways to approach this matter. Mr. Harrell recommended a motion authorizing and directing staff to make the amendments and authorizing the publication of the legal advertisement for the Public Hearing to consider such amendments.

A **motion** was made by Supervisor Child, seconded by Vice Chairman Ney and passed unanimously authorizing/directing staff to make the necessary amendments to increase the District Manager's spending limits and further authorizes publication of a legal advertisement for the Public Hearing for same for December 5, 2017.

Mr. Pickle advised that the site plan for the property along the Boulevard was on the City's agenda for approval at their next meeting.

I. District EngineerDE 1 – Status Report/Updates

Mr. Lawson noted that the system "overall" worked during Hurricane Irma. Mr. Hayden added that there was no water in the streets the next day. Mr. Lawson reminded the Board of Hurricane Isaac being a significant rain event and of several areas where water was an issue. Vice Chairman Ney congratulated Mr. Lawson for his work on the District's stormwater management system.

The issue of debris in the storm grates was brought up. It was noted that the majority of the debris was small leaves and Mr. Lawson was asked if anything could be done about it. Mr. Lawson advised that they would take a look at the different grates available, but that the majority of the debris was leaves and pine needles due to Hurricane Irma being more of a wind event.

That concluded Mr. Lawson's updates.

Mr. Pickle presented the item and recommended approval.

Under discussion, Secretary Smith asked if the \$8,520 for project management, analytics advanced services and training was a one-time fee was included in the budget. Mr. Pickle confirmed that it was.

Vice Chairman Ney's **motion** was reiterated, seconded by Secretary Smith approving the Supplement to the SunGard Public Sector LLC (Superion LLC) Application Services Provider Agreement # 141392-4, as presented. Upon being put to a vote, the **motion** carried 5 to 0.

Discussion ensued regarding the work schedule for weeks when there is a holiday. Mr. Pickle indicated that instead of 10 hour shifts, employees work 8 hour shifts.

Supervisor Child's **motion** was reiterated, seconded by Supervisor Doughney approving the District's Holiday Schedule for the 2018 Calendar Year, as amended. The **motion** carried unanimously.

DM 3 - Consider Approval for the Replacement of Two Sodium Hypochlorite Tanks for the Wastewater Treatment Plant

Mr. Pickle presented the item and recommended approval.

A **motion** was made by Secretary Smith, seconded by Vice Chairman Ney approving the proposal from Odyssey Manufacturing Company for the purchase and installation of two Poly Processing 3,150-gallon XLPE with OR-1000 LPE liner double-walled tanks for the not to exceed amount of \$35,500.

Discussion ensued regarding life expectancy and putting funds into R&R down the road to handle this item. Mr. Pickle advised that he would look into it in the future, but that the District only does a 5 year projection.

Discussion then ensued regarding corrosive liquid. Mr. Pickle clarified that the tank failure leaked chlorine bleach and was not that bad. He indicated that it was reported

to the State, as required. Mr. Miller noted that the amount of chlorine bleach leaked was less than the reportable quantity.

Secretary Smith's **motion** was reiterated, seconded by Vice Chairman Ney approving the proposal from Odyssey Manufacturing Company for the purchase and installation of two Poly Processing 3,150-gallon XLPE with OR-1000 LPE liner double-walled tanks for the not to exceed amount of \$35,500; Renewal & Replacement Available Fund Balance of \$117,903; This Project \$35,500; leaving an Available Balance of \$82,403, as presented. Upon being put to a vote, the **motion** carried unanimously.

A **motion** was made by Supervisor Child, seconded by Supervisor Doughney approving the Purchase the Aquatech B-10-1450 Jet/Vac Truck with the 2017 Freightliner 114SD Tandem Axle 66000 GVWR 410 HP ISL Diesel Allison 4500 RDS Transmission from Pat's Pump + Blower of Orlando, Florida for the not to exceed amount of \$357,240 and to amend the Fiscal Year 2017 Budget to reflect this expenditure.

Discussion ensued regarding the fact that the truck would be encumbered in Fiscal Year 2017, but would be delivered in Fiscal Year 2018. It was noted that this purchase was budgeted for a 50/50 split in Fiscal Year 2018 from the Underground Utilities Division and the General Fund Stormwater Division Capital Outlay Equipment Code.

Supervisor Child's **motion** was reiterated, seconded by Supervisor Doughney approving the Purchase the Aquatech B-10-1450 Jet/Vac Truck with the 2017 Freightliner 114SD Tandem Axle 66000 GVWR 410 HP ISL Diesel Allison 4500 RDS Transmission from Pat's Pump + Blower of Orlando, Florida for the not to exceed amount of \$357,240 and to amend the Fiscal Year 2017 Budget to reflect this expenditure. Available Project Budget is \$400,000; This Project \$357,240; leaving an Available Balance of \$42,760. Upon being put to a vote, the **motion** carried 5 to 0.

Discussion ensued regarding the pipe size to be used in order to keep the balance between the two lakes and the City's commitment to putting in some type of walking trails and maybe a gazebo. Discussion also included parking, permitting dogs and installing waste baskets and a bag dispenser. It was noted that the lake was pretty full and that it has provided some additional storage.

Vice Chairman Ney's **motion** was reiterated, seconded by Supervisor Doughney approving Change Order #2 to J.W. Cheatham for the 2016 Stormwater Enhancement Project – Lake Harvey to leave a land bridge across the wetland to be used to develop a walking trail in the amount of \$6,231.70. The Available Project Budget is \$85,853.60; This Project \$6,231.70; leaving an Available Balance of \$79,621.90. Upon being put to a vote, the **motion** carried unanimously.

As this information has not been formally presented, Mr. Pickle indicated he would officially bring it to the Board once he receives something in writing.

LUCIE WEST SERVICES DISTRICT GENERAL AND PROCEDURAL RULES; ADOPTING A FUND BALANCE POLICY FOR THE GENERAL FUND OF THE DISTRICT; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING PROVISIONS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY FOR THIS RESOLUTION. This Resolution is adopted pursuant to Sections 120.54, 189.016, 190.008, and 190.011(5), Florida Statutes.

SECTION 2. FINDINGS. The Board of Supervisors of the St. Lucie West Services District ("Board") hereby finds and determines as follows:

- A. The St. Lucie West Services District ("District") is a local unit of special-purpose government organized and existing under and pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, as amended.
- B. The Board is authorized under Chapters 120 and 190, Florida Statutes, to adopt this Resolution as a Rule of the District.
- C. The purpose of this Rule is to adopt a fund balance policy for the General Fund of the District, and in particular to adopt a new Section 1.21, Fund Balance Policy—General Fund, of Chapter A-1, the General and Procedural Rules of the District.

- E. The Board held a public hearing on the Rule on October 3, 2017, after first publishing notice of such hearing in the manner required by Sections 120.54 and 120.81, Florida Statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE ST. LUCIE WEST SERVICES DISTRICT:

SECTION 3. CHAPTER A-1 AMENDED. Chapter A-1 of the St. Lucie West Services District General and Procedural Rules is hereby amended by adding a new Section 1.21, Fund Balance Policy—General Fund, to read as set forth in the attached Exhibit I.

SECTION 4. All resolutions and other actions of the Board in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are, to the extent of such conflict, superseded and repealed.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Rule shall become effective on October 3, 2017.

CHAPTER A-1

A-1.21 Fund Balance Policy—General Fund

- (1) <u>Purpose</u>. The District shall maintain reservations of Fund Balance, as defined in this Policy, in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 54, *Fund Balance Reporting and Governmental Fund Type Definitions* (February 2009). This Policy shall only apply to the District's General Fund. Fund Balance shall be composed of nonspendable, restricted, committed, assigned, and unassigned amounts. Fund Balance information is used to identify the available resources to repay long-term debt, reduce non-ad valorem assessments, add new governmental programs, expand existing ones, or enhance the financial position of the District, in accordance with policies established by the Board.
- (2) <u>Definitions</u>. *Fund Balance* is a measurement of available financial resources and is the difference between total assets and total liabilities in each fund. Governmental accounting principles distinguish Fund Balance classifications based on the relative strength of the constraints that control the purposes for which specified amounts can be spent. Beginning with the most restrictive constraints, Fund Balance amounts will be reported in the following categories:
- (a) *Nonspendable Fund Balance*—amounts that are not in a spendable form (e.g., inventory), or are legally or contractually required to be maintained intact (e.g., principal of an endowment fund).
- (b) Restricted Fund Balance—amounts that can be spent only for the specific purposes stipulated by external parties either constitutionally or through enabling legislation (e.g., grants or debt covenants).
- (c) Committed Fund Balance—amounts that can be used only for the specific purposes determined by a formal action of the Board. Commitments may be changed or lifted only by referring to the formal action that imposed the constraint originally.
- (d) Assigned Fund Balance—amounts intended to be used by the District for specific purposes. Intent may be expressed by the Board or by a designee to whom the Board delegates the authority. In governmental funds other than the General Fund, assigned balance represents the amount that is not restricted or committed. This indicates that resources in other governmental funds are, at a minimum, intended to be used for the purpose of that fund (e.g., Impact Funds).
- (e) Unassigned Fund Balance—includes all amounts not contained in other classifications and is the residual classification of the General Fund only. Unassigned amounts

are the portion of Fund Balance that is not obligated or specifically designated and is available for any purpose.

- (3) <u>Responsibility</u>. The responsibility for designating funds to specific classifications shall be as follows:
- (a) Committed Fund Balance—The Board is the District's highest level of decision-making authority, and the formal action that is required to be taken to establish, modify, or rescind a Fund Balance commitment is a resolution amending this Policy approved by the Board in accordance with Sections 120.54 and 120.81, Florida Statutes.
- (b) Assigned Fund Balance—The District Board of Supervisor's has authorized the District Manager as the official authorized to assign Fund Balance to a specific purpose as approved by this Fund Balance Policy.
- (4) <u>Minimum Unassigned Fund Balance</u>. It is the goal of the District to achieve and maintain an Unassigned Fund Balance in the General Fund at fiscal year end of not less than seventeen percent (17%) of expenditures, which represents approximately two (2) months' operating expenditures. If the Unassigned Fund Balance at fiscal year end falls below the goal, the District shall develop a restoration plan to achieve and maintain the minimum fund balance.

(5) Use of Unassigned Fund Balance.

- (a) Disbursement of funds from Unassigned Fund Balance in excess of the seventeen percent (17%) target shall be authorized by a resolution of the Board and may be approved by inclusion in the approved annual budget (and amendments thereto). These funds shall be used only for non-recurring expenditures such as capital, grants, one-time programs, or for emergency and disaster relief, or as a budget stabilization reserve in the case of revenue declines, unanticipated expenditures, or unfunded mandates.
- (b) Should a projected budget surplus exist in any given year, such surplus may be used to offset operating expenses in the subsequent year, provided that such usage does not reduce Unassigned Fund Balance below the seventeen percent (17%) target. Such use of Unassigned Fund Balance shall represent an Assignment of Fund Balance and be at the discretion of the District Manager when preparing the annual budget, subject to approval of the budget by resolution of the Board.
- (c) After completion of the annual audit, the projected budget surplus will be compared to the actual surplus, and appropriate budget amendments made to adjust the budgeted Unassigned Fund Balance to actual. If the budgeted use of Unassigned Fund Balance causes the balance to fall below the seventeen percent (17%) target, the Finance Administrator will so ad-

vise the District Manager and the Board in order for the necessary action to be taken to restore the Unassigned Fund Balance to the target level.

- (d) Disbursement of funds from Unassigned Fund Balance below the seventeen percent (17%) target is to be used only for emergency and disaster relief or as a budget stabilization reserve in the case of revenue declines, unanticipated expenditures, or unfunded mandates. The District shall develop a restoration plan and attempt to replenish these funds over a period not to exceed five (5) years.
- (6) Order of Expenditure of Funds. When multiple categories of Fund Balance are available for expenditure (e.g., a project is being funded partly by a grant, funds set aside by the Board, and Unassigned Fund Balance), the District will start with the most restricted category and spend those funds first before moving down to the next category with available funds.

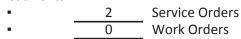

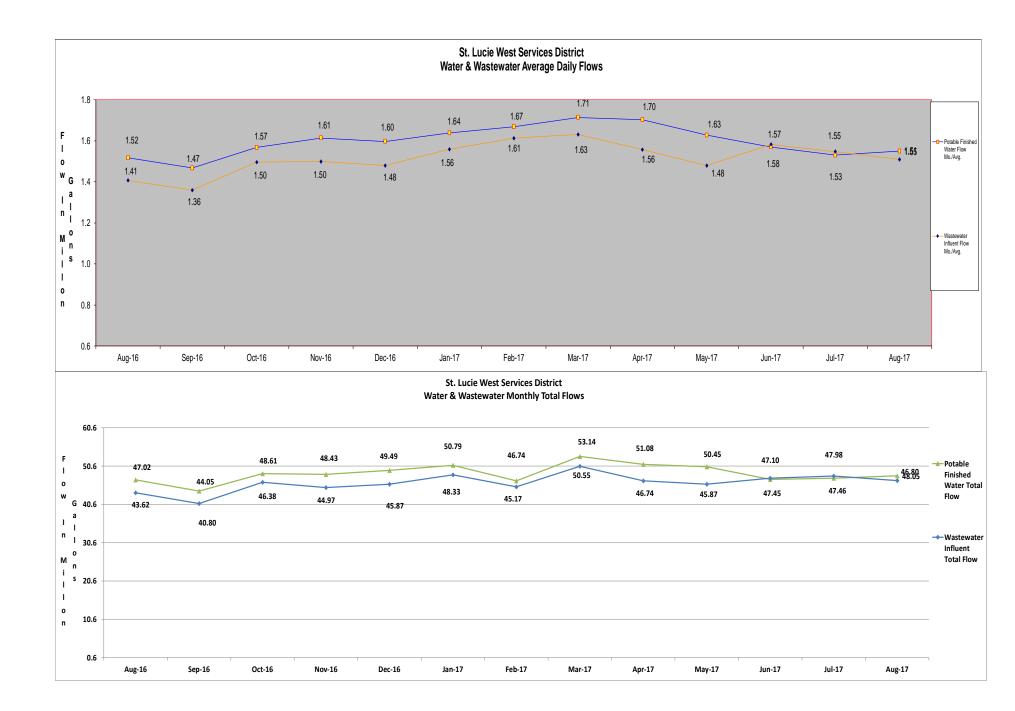


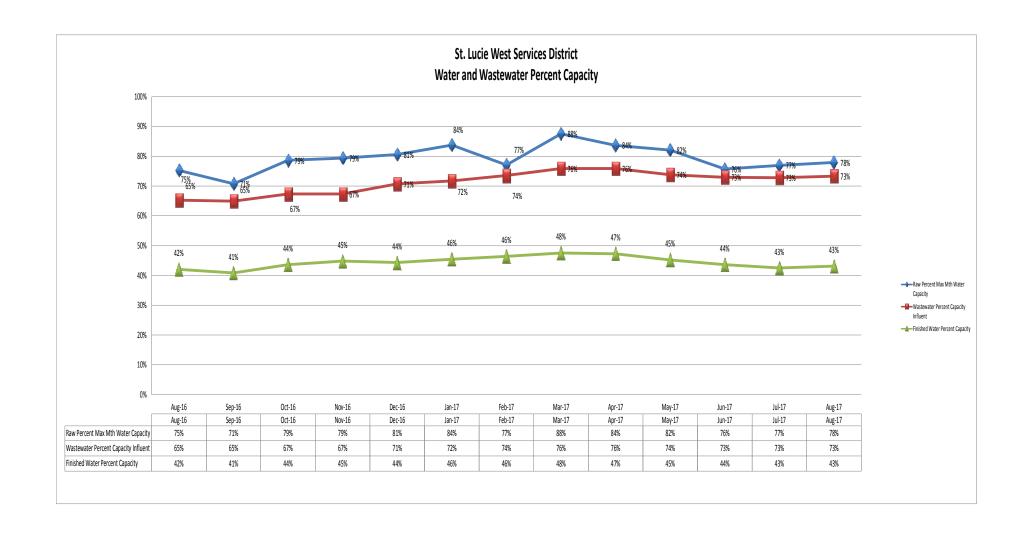
